

Setting up a HTML Project in NetBeans

To start HTML/JavaScript development in the NetBeans IDE, you first need to create a project. A project contains the information on the location of the project files and the way you want to run and debug your application (run configuration).

1. From SED Software on the desktop start NetBeans.

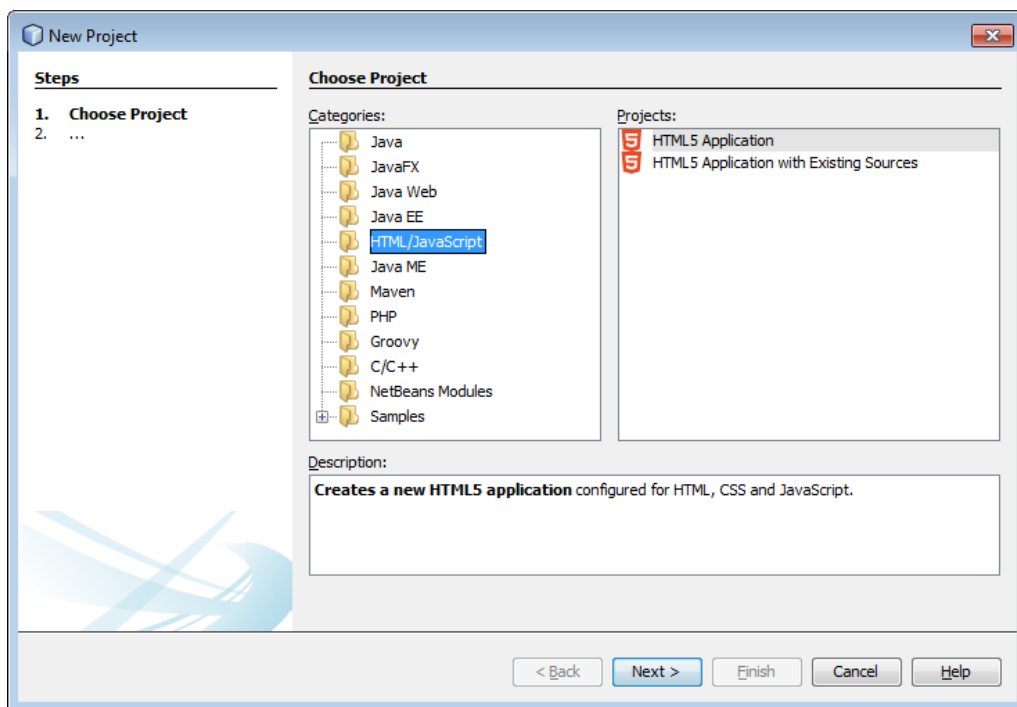
SED Software > NetBeans > NetBeans IDE 7.3/4

2. To create a HTML5 project choose **File > New Project**.

3. The Choose Project panel opens.

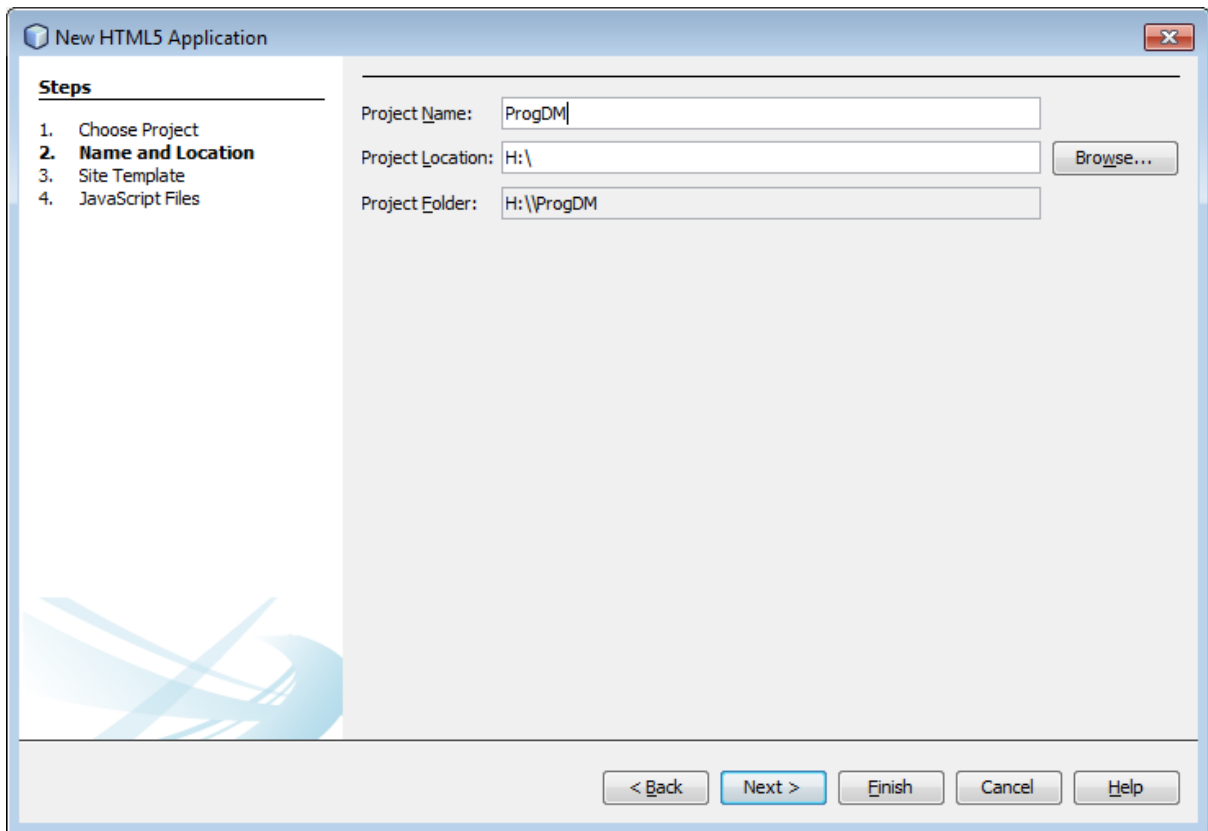
In the Categories list, choose **HTML5**

In the Projects area, choose **HTML5/JavaScript Application**



Click Next.

4. The New PHP Project Name and Location panel opens.



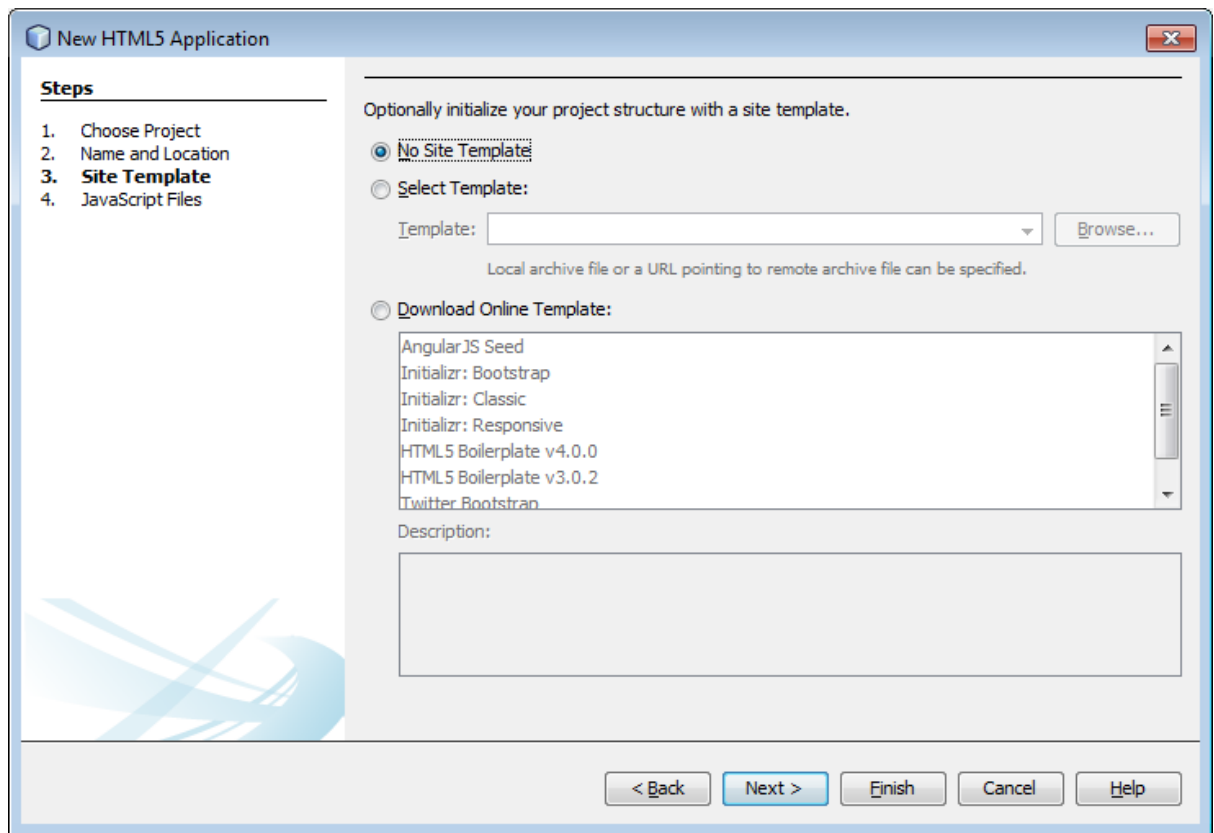
Set the Project Name: to say **ProgDM**

The Project Location: to **H:**

The Project Folder: should be now **H:\\ProgDM**

Click Next.

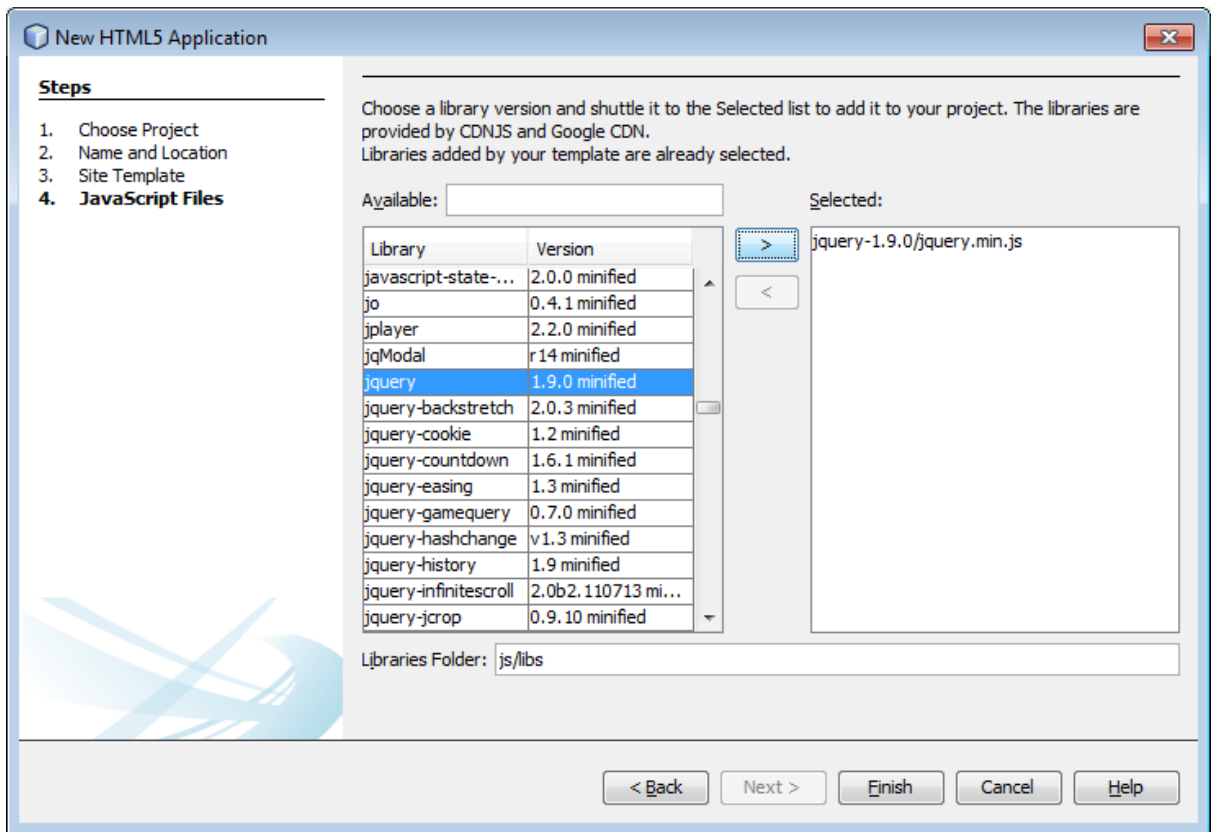
5. The Site Template window opens



Just accept the default – **No Site Template**

Click Next.

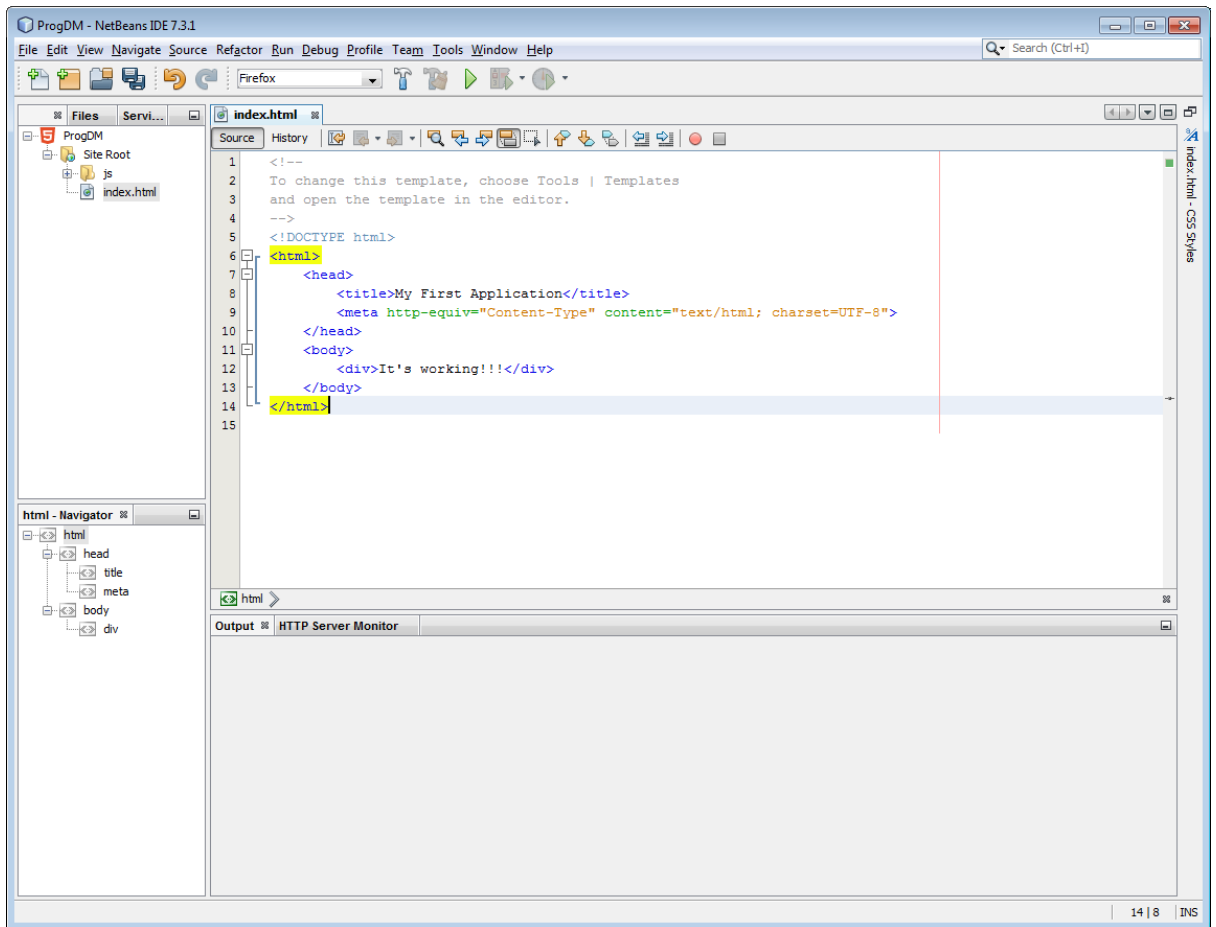
The JavaScript Files window opens:



Scroll down and select the **jquery** library and add it to your **Selected:** list

Click Finish.

The project should now be constructed and the **index.html** opened in NetBeans



Select **FireFox** as the default browser from the browser drop-down

Set the `<title>` to: **My First App**

And the `<div >` body content to: **It's working.**

Right-click on `index.html` and select **Run File**

Your `index` file should be opened by FireFox.
